About the Commission

The West Bengal Minorities' Commission (W.B.M.C.) is a statutory body under Minority Affairs and Madrasah Education Department.

The Commission was constituted through enactment of the West Bengal Minorities'

This body, while discharging functions enshrined u/s 4 of West Bengal Minorities' mmission Act 1996, also functions as apex body in the State of West Bengal for the ressal of grievances of Minorities.

part from that, six linguistic groups namely, Urdu, Hindi, Nepali, Odiya, Gurmukhi and ali are recognised as Linguistic Minorities under West Bengal Minorities' Commission 996.

sere are Chairperson, Vice-Chairman and 9 other members in the Commission.

Out of 9 members, 6 members are from each religious community, 1 woman member and two open seats. Another 3 are ex-officio members — a) Member Secretary, West Bengal Minorities' Commission and - b) Secretary, Minority Affairs & Madrasah Education Department c) One nominated Representative from West Bengal Minority Development & Finance Corporation.

The tenure of each member is 3 years.

Function of Commission

The Commission performs the following duties as described u/s 4 of West Bengal Minorities' Commission Act 1996: -

- a) Evaluate the progress of the development of Minorities of West Bengal and review implementation of the policies and programme of the State Government.
- Monitor the working of the safeguards provided in the Constitution and in laws enacted by Parliament or the State Government.
- c) Make recommendations for effective enforcement and implementation of safeguards for the protection of the minorities provided by the Central or State Government.
- d) Look into specific complaints regarding deprivation of social, economic, educational, cultural and linguistic rights and safeguards of the Minorities and take up such matters with the appropriate authorities.
- e) Recommend to the State Government to accord minority status to religious, linguistic and ethnic groups, who do not enjoy any constitutional or statutory benefits or status.
- f) Cause studies to be undertaken into problems arising out of any discrimination against minorities and recommend measures for their removal.
- g) Conduct studies, research and analysis on the issues relating to socio-economic and educational development of minorities.
- Make Annual Report to the State Government on any matter pertaining to any of the functions of the Commission.
- The Commission has the power of a civil court trying a suit while performing the functions under sub-section (1).
- j) The Commission shall, while investigating or enquiring into any complaints regarding violation or infringement of any rights of the Minority as guaranteed by the Constitution or as conferred by or under any Central Act or State Act, shall have all the powers of a civil court trying a suit under the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908, and in particular, in respect of the following matters: -
 - Summoning and enforcing the attendance of any person from any part of India, and examining him on oath.
 - ii. Requiring the discovery and production of any document.
 - iii. Receiving evidence on affidavits.
 - iv. Requisitioning any public record or copy thereof from any court or office.
 - Issuing commissions for the examination of witness and documents any other matter which may be prescribed.

Study Visit

As per power conferred under section 4(1) of West Bengal Minorities' Commission Act 1996, the Commission conducts district study tours in order to (a) evaluate the progress of the development of minorities of West Bengal and review implementation of the policies and Programme of the State Government, (b) monitor the working of the safeguards provided in the Constitution and in laws enacted by Parliament or the State Legislature and (c) make recommendations for the effective enforcement and implementation of safeguards for the protection of the interests of minorities provided by the Central or State Government.

The Study visit team usually comprises of Hon'ble Chairperson and/ or Vice Chairman and other Hon'ble members of this Commission. In the Administrative meeting, generally held at the District Head quarter, the members of this Commission meet the entire District Administrative heads and Police Administration. The Commission enquires about the development of minorities and review implementation of different policies and Programme of the State Government in the District, listens to the difficulties faced by the minorities and advises The District Administration accordingly. In the Financial Year 2021-22, the Commission only managed to visit 3 districts, namely, Uttar Dinajpur, Dakshin Dinajpur and Malda due to Covid Protocol.

The petitioner also accused Shri De for threatening his son, Khairul Islam, over phone asking him to arrange for bail of the accused persons.	The Commission asked for an enquiry report from S.P. Barasat, North 24 Parganas.	The investigation report revealed that all the accused persons (3) have been put under judicial custody by the investigating officer. It has also been revealed that Sri De did threaten Khairul Islam, but it was for unlawfully taking possession of a motorcycle which the complainant gifted to his accused son-in-law.
